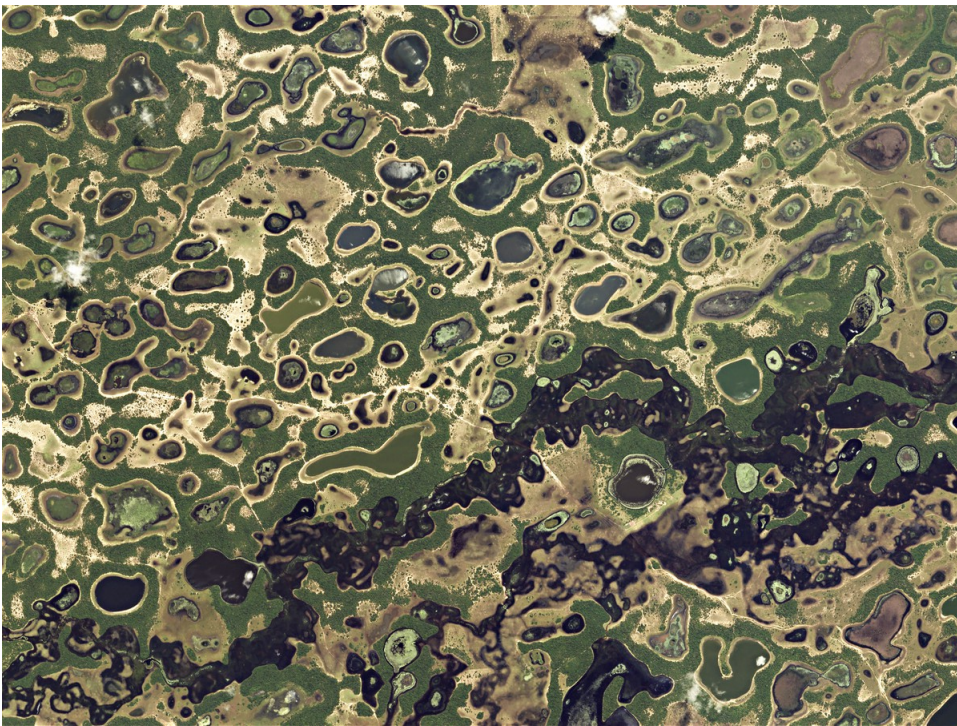


Figure 3.1: The pantanal is a wetland in South America.
